


UC Merced's operating budget remains dependent on core funds


#### **Historic Revenues**

78% of total expenditures fund salaries, benefits and student financial aid









Original Development Footprint for 2020 355 acres


1.5 million ASF of new facilities 10,000 students

219 acres → 38% smaller
1 million new ASF by 2020 → 33% less






# The original rationale for establishing UC Merced was strategic

- 3 Serve California and the region through graduate education and research




# UC Merced 10<sup>th</sup> Anniversary






